### WHAT DOES SOUTHWEST BUSINESS CORPORATION DO WITH YOUR PERSONAL INFORMATION?

#### Why?

Financial companies choose how they share your personal information. Federal law gives consumers the right to limit some but not all sharing. Federal law also requires us to tell you how we collect, share, and protect your personal information. Please read this notice carefully to understand what we do.

#### What?

The types of personal information we collect and share depend on the product or service you have with us. This information can include:

- Social Security number and transaction history
- account balances and payment history
- transaction or loss history and insurance claim history

When you are *no longer* our customer, we continue to share your information as described in this notice.

#### How?

All financial companies need to share customers' personal information to run their everyday business. In the section below, we list the reasons financial companies can share their customers' personal information; the reasons Southwest Business Corporation chooses to share; and whether you can limit this sharing.

## What we do

<p><b>How does Southwest Business Corporation protect my personal information?</b></p>	<p>To protect your personal information from unauthorized access and use, we use security measures that comply with federal law. These measures include computer safeguards and secured files and buildings.</p> <p>We also use risk-informed and industry standard security frameworks, systems, and resources to protect your information. We continuously test and monitor our services to identify and respond to threats against us.</p>
<p><b>How does Southwest Business Corporation collect my personal information?</b></p>	<p>We collect your personal information, for example, when you</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• provide account information or give us your contact information</li> <li>• pay insurance premiums or file an insurance claim</li> <li>• provide your mortgage information</li> </ul> <p>We also collect your personal information from other companies.</p>
<p><b>Why can't I limit all sharing?</b></p>	<p>Federal law gives you the right to limit only</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• sharing for affiliates' everyday business purposes— information about your creditworthiness</li> <li>• affiliates from using your information to market to you</li> <li>• sharing for non-affiliates to market to you</li> </ul> <p>State laws and individual companies may give you additional rights to limit sharing.</p>

## Definitions

<p><b>Affiliates</b></p>	<p>Companies related by common ownership or control. They can be financial and nonfinancial companies.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b><i>Southwest Business Corporation does not share with our affiliates.</i></b></li> </ul>
<p><b>Non-affiliates</b></p>	<p>Companies not related by common ownership or control. They can be financial and nonfinancial companies.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b><i>Southwest Business Corporation does not share with non-affiliates so they can market to you.</i></b></li> </ul>
<p><b>Joint marketing</b></p>	<p>A formal agreement between nonaffiliated financial companies that together market financial products or services to you.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b><i>Southwest Business Corporation does not jointly market.</i></b></li> </ul>
